Are you a farmer or artisan interested in opening or expanding a local market for your wares?

If you answered "yes" to either of those questions, then the Cross Timbers Food Co-op is for you!

The Cross Timbers Food Cooperative is committed to developing a self-reliant, self-empowering community, by offering a retail exchange to the North Texas region for goods and services which are grown, produced, traded, and distributed locally, in a sustainable, equitable, and responsible manner.

The Cross Timbers Food Co-op sells only North Texas products, stocked by the farmers and craftspeople who produced them.

The vision is to create a cooperative business that embodies 3 key values:

- (1) business profitability
- (2) social responsibility
- (3) ecological sustainability

*Orders are taken and delivered once each month.

*Suppliers receive a single order list and bring their goods to a single collection center.

*Deliveries are made to pickup points located throughout the North Texas region.

Only members may buy or sell through the co-op. A membership share costs a one-time fee of \$50 which can be paid out over time.

Five Reasons to Buy Local:

1. **Local food is fresher and tastier.**
2. **Many customers are concerned about the safety of the corporate food system and globalized economy.**
3. **People want to support more natural and sustainable farm and business practices, including more humane treatment of animals.**
4. **Supporting local farmers and businesses boosts regional economic development (circulating our money locally increases prosperity for all).**
5. **Buying local conserves more energy than shopping for food and goods shipped from thousands of miles away.**
